


Communication Friendly Settings Whole Staff Training (Early Years)




Speech and Language Support (SLS) for 0-3s or 3-5s

> 2 early years practitioners complete SLS 0-3s or 3-5s and achieve Level 3 accreditation and become Lead Communication Practitioners (LCPs).



Communication Counts (5x one-hour sessions)

LCPs cascade training to all staff, support the team and achieve Level 4 accreditation.

How to become an Elklan Communication Friendly Setting

Elklan Communication Friendly Setting (CFS) accreditation is awarded to settings that have trained all their staff in supporting speech, language and communication.

Accredited CFS status can be achieved in one year and renewed after three years. It is the most cost-effective strategy available for building capacity to support all childrens' communication skills across your whole staff team.

Becoming a CFS involves three steps:

- 1 2 or more practitioners complete Elklan's 'Speech and Language Support for 3-5s' and/or 'Speech and Language Support for 0-3s' course at Level 3.
- 2 At least one of these practitioners, cascades training to ALL staff in your setting using our course 'Communication Counts'. They are known as Lead Communication Practitioners (LCPs). We provide the teaching notes, mentoring and resources to facilitate this and support LCPs to achieve Level 4 accreditation.
- **3** Embedding of the training will be demonstrated through an audit, evidencing the impact on practices and policies within the setting.
