| 3.This Case Study is an example of... | - Successful intervention <br> - Specialist Training <br> - Co-ordinated Services |
| 4. Details of the situation and the challenges / difficulties faced by the child and / or his family | - J was referred to the Speech and Language Therapy (SLT) dept aged 12.3 yrs <br> - Failing in school academically. Becoming increasingly reluctant to attend school. Isolated <br> - Teachers reporting low level disruptive behaviour <br> - Parents requesting statement <br> - SLT assessment showed receptive language scores on Clinical Evaluation of Language Fundamentals (CELF) between standard score 3 and (percentile rank 1 to 2), standard scores on expressive scale of 3 (percentile rank 1) <br> - Academically scores well below expected for his age <br> - For example Literacy and Maths at NC levels 2 and 3 (expected level for his age is 4 or 5 ) |
| 5. What was done that made a difference to the above situation? | Input from the SLT Dept <br> - Report completed to contribute to his statement of educational need. Specific hours to support J in class were arranged <br> - In class TA support to follow Elklan guidelines of simplification instructions, use of visual support such as time lines, mind maps etc <br> - Elklan training (11-16s) provided for TAs supporting J <br> - Whole school strategies from Elklan Language Builders discussed provided agreed circulated <br> - Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator (SENCO) attended Elklan 2 day overview. |
| 6. The outcomes (What were the results for the child and, if appropriate, his family?) | - J reassessed by the SLT Dept 18 months after initial assessment. <br> - Formal assessment using the CELF shows receptive standard scores between 6 and 8 average range $8-10$ ). <br> - Expressive standard scores between 8 and 10 (this is within the average range) <br> - School assessment scores - J expected to get grades C to D at GCSE <br> - Happier in school <br> - SENCO reports that TAs who attended Elklan training are able to reword/rephrase information for J very efficiently. |
| 7. Costings and / or savings | - $£ 80$ for TAs to attend Elklan course |
| 8. The role played by SLT dept. | - Improved understanding of $J$ 's difficulties to those working with him <br> - Specific strategies given/demonstrated to staff to aid J's understanding and expressive language skills <br> - Elklan training |
